
Space Theme









Sensory: Galaxy Bin

Supplies needed:

- Beans with galaxy stones
- Stars
- Astronauts

Process:

Put all the items into your sensory bin and let your child explore the materials. Adding a metal measuring cup always makes things even more fun!



Nature: Rock and Twig Constellations

Supplies needed:

- rocks
- gems
- twigs

Process:

Take a nature walk (at night, preferably) and talk to your child about how there are constellations that are make up of stars in the sky. Collect twigs and stones and see if you can recreate any of the constellations found below.

Art: Paint a Planet

Supplies needed:

- paper lantern
- paint
- paint brush

Process:

Look at some pictures of planets with your child and talk about how they are made up of so many different colors. Have your child paint their lantern and hang it for a cute homemade craft.



Science: Make a telescope

Supplies needed:

- black paint
- star sticker
- paintbrush
- cardboard tube



Process:

Talk to your child about how people study stars with a handy tool called a telescope. Have your child paint the tube all over in the color black. When it is dry, allow them to put stickers all over it to help improve fine motor skills. Let them explore the sky with their new telescope when they are done.
